Taffee volunteered to do research and report to the group via email her findings.

<u>Montgomery Cabin – Elk City Wagon Rd</u>:

Since this on Forest Service property coordination would have to be done through that agency to see if getting it place on the Register would be possible.

Len and Grace Jordan House in Grangeville:

Jordan's lived on the Kirkwood Ranch and moved to Grangeville in the early 1950. Len Jordan was Idaho Governor and US Senator. His wife Grace wrote the book: *Home Below Hell's Canyon*. Their original home is still standing in the Grangeville. Erin is acquainted with the family that presently lives in the house. She will contact and report back at next meeting.
